

**Board of Trustees Meeting**  
**September 5, 2017**

Department of Public Works

Trustee Fitzgerald reported that in anticipation of the new school year, the Department of Public Works has been busy over the past few weeks re-stripping the various crosswalks, especially those near our schools.

Now that the summer season at the Recreation Center is over, the Department of Public Works will again start to focus on upgrades to the Shelter House and the stucco on the storage shed.

Over the past few weeks, the Highway Department worked on a number of 'low' spots, especially in the North End where, after storms, water was not flowing properly. In addition, while working on these spots, they cleared out some of the storm drains.

Fire Department

Trustee Pombonyo reported that, with 118 calls during the month of August, our fire department continues to be busy with its firefighting and medical emergency duties as well as significant community service.

Partnering with a local United States Marines veterans group, our fire department has joined the efforts to help the victims of Hurricane Harvey. The fire department continues to collect non-perishable foods, personal health care items, and baby supplies. Drop-off boxes are located in our Village buildings. The community's response has been overwhelming and all contributions are appreciated.

In the area of ongoing fire department training, our Floral Park firefighters and EMTs will be participating in a First Battalion drill on Friday, September 22nd. Mutual department operations will be the focus as all of these departments provide and often rely on each other for mutual aid support. Then, on Thursday evening, September 28th, there will be a full Floral Park Fire Department drill involving our firefighters and EMT staff. In October, additional training will take place as the Floral Park Fire Department joins Bellerose Village at the Nassau County Fire Services Academy in Bethpage for four hands-on practice sessions in putting out actual fires in a variety of mock-up building structures resembling those located in our communities.
