**Board of Trustees Meeting**  
**November 21, 2017**

Building Department

Trustee Fitzgerald reported that during the month of October, the Building Department issued 25 building permits with total construction costs of \$829,000, 18 plumbing permits, 7 amended permits, 8 fence permits, 23 electrical permits and 10 sign permits.

Trustee Fitzgerald said that he is truly thankful to live in such a wonderful Village. He thanked all the residents, Village employees and Village volunteers for everything they do and wished everyone a very Happy Thanksgiving.

Floral Park Conservation Society & Centennial Gardens

Trustee Pombonyo reported that, on Saturday, November 18th, the Conservation Society hosted a very productive volunteer day at the Gardens. About fifty volunteers from FPCS, the Chaminade High School service organizations and Boy Scout Troop 298 spent the day replanting and refurbishing inner and outer bushes and flowers. Approximately 120 donated plants and shrubs, of all sizes, were added. This transformation was spearheaded by FPCS expert, local resident, and volunteer Stephen Koste.
