MAYOR TWEEDY: At this time we move to Local Law number 3, a Local Law to consider the enactment of a moratorium within the Village of Floral Park. I would ask our Village Clerk, Susan Walsh, once again, to read the Public Notice.

Thank you, Mayor MS. WALSH: Tweedy. Notice of Public Hearing of the Village of Floral Park, proposed Local Law number 3 of 2016. Please take notice that pursuant to Article 9 of the New York State Constitution, the provisions of the Code of the Village of Floral Park and the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York, a public hearing will held in the Incorporated Village of Floral Park at Village Hall, One Floral Boulevard, Floral Park, New York on the 1st day of November, 2016, at 8:00 p.m. in the evening of that day, to consider the enactment of a local law entitled "A Local Law establishing a moratorium on subdivisions under the Code of the Incorporated Village of

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Floral Park." This local law shall take effect immediately upon its filing with the Secretary of State. It was dated October 26, 2016. By Order of the Board of Trustees, Village of Floral Park, Susan E. Walsh, Village Clerk.

MAYOR TWEEDY: Thank you, very much, Ms. Walsh. I would like to place on the record that the Board has previously adopted a negative declaration, meaning that the proposed Local Law will have no significant impact on the environment. The Village Board of Trustees, the legislative intent. The Village Board of Trustees has requested the moratorium be enacted so it might have sufficient opportunity to determine whether further subdivisions would be allowed within the Village. This moratorium will provide an opportunity for the Village Board of Trustees to evaluate the changes needed to receive information from all interested, and in establishing this moratorium, the Board of Trustees has

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also considered the need for conserving the value of buildings and land and the need to encourage the most appropriate use of land; two: The need to attract retail businesses of such character as to encourage, foster and promote the revitalization of business districts; To ensure adequate parking, lessen congestion while balancing the needs; four: To provide adequate light and air; five: To ensure compatibility with the surrounding uses; six: establish a comprehensive plan without the pressure of new businesses that conflict with the overall goal and reasonable development of the community; seven: To encourage historic preservation.

At this time, I would ask if anyone would have any comments you would like to make as to this Local Law and this moratorium? If you would, come forward and kindly give your name. Hearing none, I would ask for a motion to adopt Local Law number 3 for a moratorium.
