MAYOR LONGOBARDI: Now Miss Walsh, move on to Local Law number 3.

MS. WALSH: Legal Notice of the Incorporated Village of Floral Park, Notice of Public Hearing Proposed Local Law number 3 of 2019.

Please Take Notice that pursuant to
Article 9 of the New York State Constitution,
the provisions of the Code of the Incorporated
Village of Floral Park and the Municipal Home

MAYOR LONGOBARDI: Thank you very much. I would now like to announce the Board previously adopted a negative declaration, meaning that the proposed Local Law has no significant impact upon the environment.

I would like to also read the legislative intent of the law. This local law amends a Village Code to provide so as to provide a marijuana retail store or medical marijuana dispensary may only be located in a B3 zoning district.

With that, I will open it up to our Village Board. Is there anyone who has any comment they would like to make?

TRUSTEE POMBONYO: I would. Thank you.

As a lifelong educator including being a former Superintendent of Schools, I find it reprehensible we're in a position tonight considering this legislation.

In our school district and throughout New

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York State, ironically, it is required that the K through 12, we have strong and comprehensive substance abuse prevention and education programs that must be taught in our schools. This obviously includes education about the dangers of marijuana as our students get into the upper elementary and high school grades. This is required by New York State. And yet, we're now in a position where our state leaders in government are saying that in -- it is legal to do this. It is okay. And by the way, we're not even giving, at this point, villages the discretion to be able to make their own laws to prohibit its use in the Village if the residents, if the business owners, if the Village government so decides.

This is not for our Village. I think clearly our Board has made the point that we strongly feel that way by inviting Lieutenant Doherty here tonight, who's worked in our schools, has worked in our schools with Officer John Groshan's for many years. In part, some of that same education for our students at the appropriate grade level and appropriate levels of understanding to prevent our students from

engaging in the use of this kind of dangerous substance. So the fact that we are here considering this legislation tonight is very distasteful to us as well too.

I do want to add just a little bit about the restrictions that the law imposes. It's some assurance that any kind of legalized use by New York State will be very highly controlled here. But the fact that it could be here at all, as I said, is not a good prediction of things to come in our future and we hope we won't reach that point.

In terms of restriction, number one any of the above uses we talked about, marijuana shall not be located within a 200 foot radius in areas zoned for residential use. There's a radius thing that's related within one fourth mile radius of another similar use. And any of the above uses shall not be located 250 feet of a school, church, place of worship, park, playground or playing field.

So, in addition to limiting them to a very tight zone of the Village B3 District, there's also distance restrictions on how close or how far it must be from these places which tends to

attract children to them.

We appreciate you all coming out tonight and consider your comments, but do want you to know that, as Mayor Longobardi said, you saw the Newsday article yesterday, this is not by any means the choice, if we had a choice, that we would make to legalize it in any area of our Village. Thank you.

MAYOR LONGOBARDI: Trustee Cheng?

TRUSTEE CHENG: One of the great things about living in Floral Park is we see all the benefits we have. We see our police department, our pool, fire department, playground and all the other things I'm not going to mention.

One of the unseen things that people don't really realize is the fact that being a Village, we have our own zoning laws. This is the shield that we, as a Board, and we, as a Mayor and the Board, can utilize to protect our residents when higher authority tells us, no, you can't protect them. But this is our Village and these are our laws. As long as they're reasonable and conform to a lot of rules I know, this will work to the best that

we can do.

MAYOR LONGOBARDI: Thank you. Anybody else who would like to comment? With that, we will open it up to the floor to any of our residents or business owners. We have to ask you to please come up, if you state your name and be sworn in. This is a matter of public record.

(Whereupon, Ms. Herger was sworn in.)

MS. HERGER: Melanie Herger, H-E-R-G-E-R.

MAYOR LONGOBARDI: Your address?

MS. HERGER: Resident of Floral Park, 46
Maple Avenue.

MAYOR LONGOBARDI: Thank you. Thank you for coming.

MS. HERGER: I just have a quick question.

I'm unfamiliar with the zone you're talking
about exactly, where it is.

MAYOR LONGOBARDI: The B3 zone is basically, if I had to give you just an idea where it is, it is right behind Stella's Restaurant on Jericho Turnpike. So, it is the block behind there, sort of the industrial area north of what would be the parking lot, Creedmor Spur parking lot in that area.

MS. HERGER: It is not on Jericho then?

MAYOR LONGOBARDI: It is not on Jericho,
just south behind Stella's.

MS. HERGER: That was my question. Thank you.

MAYOR LONGOBARDI: Thank you so much. I ask that you be sworn in and state your name and address.

(Whereupon, Ms. Lally was sworn in.)

MS. LALLY: Kathleen Lally, L-A-L-L-Y, 64
Willis Avenue. I will play devils advocate. I
don't know whether I agree or disagree with
what I am about to say, something about the
reading of the law has me a little confused
When we say a marijuana shop and we include
dispensary together, as of now, it is legal for
medicinal marijuana.

Now, are we able to put that in with the same of the recreational shop or are we going to be challenged on that? I say it because I have a family member who uses medicinal marijuana and will tell you from our point, it is very effective. It is a child with autism who has seizures. It has proven to be very effective. I would say my sister—in—law was

probably first on line when it became legal.

He is 20 years old. We have seen the difference. I'm not saying we need to have dispensaries in Floral Park. I'm not stating that. I don't want you to think I am promoting it.

I'm asking, by putting two together, the recreational end of it and medicinal, are we going to be challenged when it comes? Could we be challenged in court because we're saying dispensary has to be admitted to the R-3? I don't have an answer on it.

TRUSTEE CHENG: That's the whole point of enacting it the way we have done it. We're not banning it, but limiting it to the area where it can be open. There's a place where it can open, if a permit was taken out for it.

MS. LALLY: Dispensary now is legal already?

TRUSTEE CHENG: We had no application to open one now. We have a law that says you can open it in this location.

MS. LALLY: It won't be challenged because we put the dispensary?

MR. RYAN: Anything can be challenged.

 $\operatorname{\mathtt{MAYOR}}$ LONGOBARDI: I will leave that to the lawyer in the room.

MS. LALLY: I was wondering now the dispensary are, you know, in prominent places. They're in shopping malls. They're up in Lake Success where my sister—in—law has to come. There's different places it is acceptable and it is not considered what I would say we're looking at shops and saying, oh God, no. I'm looking at dispensaries. I know it did not have a negative effect on our family. So, I'm throwing it out there, playing devil's advocate. I'm not looking for a fight.

MAYOR LONGOBARDI: Again, Mrs. Lally, thank you very much. Those are the discussions we have as we propose these laws. But reality, as Trustee Cheng said and Village Attorney John Ryan said, if somebody is to give us an application to open a dispensary, they're limited to the area.

MS. LALLY: All right. Thank you.

MAYOR LONGOBARDI: Anybody else who would like to be heard on this? Okay. I thank everybody for their comments. I will give the Board one last chance if they want to be heard
