I wish to read the intent of the local law. This amends the section of the code, location of air conditioning equipment and generators on residential properties within the Village.

I would like to comment that we found a need to have to do this and I want to thank the Building Superintendent of Public Works, Renee Marcus, for her work on this. As you know, air conditioners and placement of air conditioners and generators on anybody's property is guided by the rules and regulations with the advent of new split units and much better, different noise level air conditioners and things like that. We have been able to modify our law to adopt to the new type of equipment that is out there. That's what this is doing.

With that, I ask the Board if they have any comments on this local law they wish to enter into the record?

TRUSTEE CHENG: I would like to.

MAYOR LONGOBARDI: Okay.

TRUSTEE CHENG: This is long overdue. As a real estate attorney, I felt with this whole

issue of legalizing air-conditioning units in my practice and generators, as we all know, there's no such thing as climate change and storms get worse and worse. So, the idea of having a generator now makes sense to incorporate at this time. When you weigh the split units and some of the central units, as far as noise, in comparison to having your neighbor with a window air conditioner at 20 something thousand BTUs, these new units are so much quieter and it just makes sense to move in that direction.

So, I applaud our Superintendent, Renee Marcus, to bringing this to us. I have been mentioning it for years. I am glad to see, hopefully, this passes tonight.

How will this impact current homeowners who may have been in compliance and who might not be going forward? Would they have to get new equipment?
