Just three years ago, Ann Corbett donated a kidney to her husband, Bill, at NYU Langone Health. The successful surgery was performed by renowned surgeon Dr. Robert Montgomery, himself a heart transplant recipient, who was awarded the Hearts For Russ Physician Award.
