# Dear Friends,

As another eventful year comes to a close, I would like to recap some of the highlights and achievements that our Village accomplished during the year. These items have allowed our Village to not only remain a great place to live, work and raise a family today but they also ensure that future generations will be able to keep that commitment alive. It is important to acknowledge that all of these items are the efforts of teams that work collaboratively to ensure the projects have a successful completion. Our entire Village community has benefited from the hard work and dedication of all our Village employees as well 100's of volunteers who serve on committees or have an active role in our Fire Department. Below are a few highlights of particular interest:

# **Energy Performance Contract**

• In 2023 we signed an Energy Performance contract with Johnson Controls which has allowed us to bundle under one project a number of projects (e.g., boilers, LED lighting in Village buildings, Library roof, solar panels on the DPW building, etc.) while using the future energy savings to offset/payback some of the cost of the projects over time. # **Trees:**

• Another asset of the Village that requires significant attention and, every so often, removal and replacement, are our Village trees. The Village is very proud of our trees and our "Tree City USA" designation. In order to maintain our "Tree City" designation, each year the Village has to apply to the National Arbor Day Foundation and provide significant data to show that the Village meets their requirements and that the Village takes our tree management and replacement seriously. Included in the data in this year's submission to the Arbor Day

Foundation are the following facts from the past year: (i) the Village had to remove 60 trees for various reasons including a disease affecting over 50 Ash and Oak trees; (ii) we planted 300 new trees throughout the Village (and that does not include anything at Centennial Gardens); and (iii) the Village pruned 150 trees. As stated, our trees are a great asset and the Village is committed to responsibly preserving and maintaining them.

# Road Program

- In 2023 we continued with our Road Program which included the total reconstruction of both Clayton Avenue and Hinsdale Avenue between Jericho Turnpike and Lowell Avenue.
  - Additionally, we continue to work with National Grid and the Water Authority of Western Nassau as they open roads for their projects. You have probably noticed many streets that have been partially opened by these utilities. For the past few years, the Village has been working with National Grid for funding for overlays of the entire street (rather than just a patch of the excavated area). Under this approach, National Grid pays to the Village the amount National Grid would pay to patch the roads due to their work. The Village then applies those funds to do an overlay of the entire street. The cost paid by National Grid equals approximately one-third of the complete overlay cost. In this manner, the Village is able to do more road overlay projects throughout the Village. Also, there is a benefit in that the roads that have been overlayed are less likely to be disrupted by utility work in the near future. This year, we were able to do an overlay on several streets impacted by National Grids' work, including: Harvard, Nassau and Lexington Streets, and portions of Carnation and Verbena Avenues. Unfortunately, there has been a delay in addressing some of the roads recently impacted by National Grid's work because we have been advised by the Water Authority of Nassau County (WAWNC) that they are planning a project for this coming Spring which will require extensive excavation of . . .

working with them in the coming year as the new mall opens.

many of these same roads. We have been in discussions with the WAWNC for a similar funding arrangement as with National Grid and look forward to completing the overlay of these roads once WAWNC completes their work. We appreciate our residents' patience as National Grid and WAWNC continue with their projects in 2024.

 Also, this year we were able to do an overlay on a portion of Carnation Avenue funded by a separate grant from New York State.

# **Third Track**

Even though the Third Track project has been completed and the new tracks and schedules have been in operation for most of the year, the Village continues to work with the Long Island Rail Road (LIRR) to complete a number of unfinished projects related to the Third Track project. These included a new protective fence at the end of Tunnel Street and landscaping on Main Street and Hanover Street as well as a few other spots along the Main line. We continue to work with the LIRR and hope to have resolutions early in the New Year on potential mitigation for certain properties along the Hempstead line and on the "haul route" roads (e.g., Terrace Avenue, Avenue, etc.). It is important to note that even though it has not yet been determined as to the amount of the LIRR's responsibility for the deterioration of the road on Hanover Street, the Village repaved it in November due to the significant damage this road sustained. We could not wait until the Spring. I would like to thank Trustee Stewart and Village Administrator Bambrick for the hours of work and advocacy they have put in over the past year on these issues.

# **Belmont Park**

- The New York Racing Association (NYRA) has started the work on the multi-year project to redevelop Belmont Park. These redevelopment plans include a brand-new Grandstand, 4 new racing surfaces including a new winter track, and a new backyard. NYRA recently announced that due to the ongoing construction, the 2024 Belmont Stakes will be held at Saratoga. Although we are disappointed that Belmont Park will not be the site of next year's Belmont Stakes, we plan on working with the Floral Park Chamber of Commerce on still having the Tulip Avenue Street Fair the night before the Belmont Stakes. Additionally, management at NYRA has kept us apprised of ongoing and upcoming milestones with the redevelopment. This includes regular meetings of the Belmont Park Advisory Board which both Trustee Chiara and I attend as members.
- I would like to also like to thank the team at the UBS Arena and Oak View Group for working with us and attending to any issues that have arisen over the past two years since the arena has opened. We look forward to

# **Downtown Revitalization/NY Forward Grants**

- The Village for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year has submitted an application to New York State to have our downtowns included in the State's Downtown Revitalization Initiative. This year we focused on and applied for the NY Forward grant. The entire application as well as an overview of the NY Forward Program can be found on our website. I encourage all residents and business owners to review to see some of the ideas that can be accomplished with this grant (link <a href="https://fpvillage.org/wp-content/uploads/2023/10/Floral-Park-2023-NYF-Application.pdf">https://fpvillage.org/wp-content/uploads/2023/10/Floral-Park-2023-NYF-Application.pdf</a>). Even though to date we have not been awarded one of the few grants per year given out on Long Island, we continue to use this process to explore projects that come up during discussions to see if we can move forward with some of these projects even without the grant.
- Additionally, we were excited to welcome a number of new businesses to the Village this year. It seems that restaurants continue to thrive here in the Village. We thank all of the entrepreneurs who risk their capital to bring not only needed services to the Village but also ones that are enjoyable and continue to enhance a sense of community.

# **Drainage**

Speaking of grants, we were pleased to be informed in September that Congressman D'Esposito secured United States House of Representative approval for \$4,050,000 in federal funds for the Village to start and complete the long -awaited new sump/recharge basin in Belmont Park near the dead end of Clover. As you may remember, New York State provided the Village with an easement on Belmont Park property a number of years ago for a site to build the new recharge basin. We will still need United States Senate approval of the House funding bill (which, we are advised, is expected hopefully in January). We are now in the process of preparing the bid documents for the new recharge basin construction. Once funding is approved and the bidding process is completed, we can start and complete the project.

# **Fire Department**

In February of 2023, following extensive planning by the Fire Chiefs and working with Deputy Mayor Pombonyo, the Village entered into a contract with NYU Langone to provide first response ambulance service to village residents. NYU Langone trained paramedics are qualified to diagnostically test and begin treatment (e.g. administer medications, start IVs, etc.) at the scene. The NYU Langone ambulance is staged at Village Hall to provide immediate response times. The Village Volunteer ambulance service, our Rescue Department, is still active to provide second call responses. The NYU Langone ambulance together with the Fire Department Rescue ambulance provide enhanced critical services to our residents.

# **Police**

• This year the Floral Park Police Department implemented a new "Computer Aided Dispatch" (CAD) communication system which allows our Police Department to communicate simultaneously with multiple agencies in emergencies and to have access to extensive data relating to those emergencies, criminal history and other police-related matters.

# **4Village Studios**

• 4 Village Studio is celebrating their 25<sup>th</sup> year of being on the air. I would like to thank James Green, the Studio's Operation Manager, and his team of volunteers who have consistently brought award winning shows to our communities. # **Recycling Collection Schedule Changes**

Earlier this year we changed our garbage and recycling pickup schedules. Due to feedback from our residents and after a thorough review of the changes implemented last year, we are going to make some improvements to the schedule starting January 1, 2024. The primary change is that recycling will no longer be Village-wide on Wednesdays. Rather, starting in January 2024, all Village recycling will coincide with residential garbage collection days. For example, if your garbage collection is Mondays and Thursdays, paper and cardboard will be collected on Mondays and plastics and glass collection will be on Thursdays. If your garbage collection days are Tuesdays and Fridays, paper and cardboard collection will be on Tuesdays and plastics and glass will be picked up on Fridays. This will ensure that recycling will be picked up every week including weeks in which there is a holiday. More details about the changes to the recycling schedule can be found on the flyer from our Department of Public Works at page 5.

# **Best in Nassau County Awards**

 Thanks to the dedication and creativity of our Library staff and Library Board, the Floral Park Library was once again, for the third time, voted "Best Library in Nassau County". Also, our volunteers and leadership of the Floral Park Conservation Society, together with our Parks and DPW teams, earned Centennial Gardens a repeat win in the category for "Best Public Garden in Nassau County."

# **Military Banners**

• I would like thank everyone who purchased a banner earlier this year as part of the Military Tribute Banner Program, jointly sponsored by the Floral Park American Legion and the Village.

What a great way to honor and remember our residents and loved ones who served our Country. These banners will be back up in the Spring prior to Memorial Day.

# ASSESSMENT DEADLINE



Residents are reminded that January 2, 2024 is the filing deadline for all village property tax exemptions. Senior Exemption Renewal Applications were mailed out in September. There is a maximum income limit of \$58,399 for the Partial Senior Citizen Exemption this year. Please file early as incomplete applications or applications missing required financial statements will be

rejected at the deadline.

**New Senior** applicants can call the Assessment Department at 326-6305 for information and an application.

Veterans' applications and Volunteer Firefighter applications are available on our website "fpvillage.org" as well as at Village Hall and at the Assessment Department located at 1 Pool & Garage Road. We remind the veterans that a local law passed in 2000 allows veterans who own shares in cooperative apartment complexes to file for a partial tax exemption. We also remind and encourage any veteran having a Disability Rating or a change in his or her Disability Rating, to contact the Assessment Department. Change requests and new applications must be submitted by the January 2, 2024 deadline.

If you are a **new property owner** in the village or you are a property owner who has a **mailing address change**, **bank change**, **or have satisfied your mortgage**, please contact the Assessment Department as soon as possible to update our records and direct future tax bills and correspondence to the correct address or bank.


