Our Officers sustained leg injuries which required medical treatment, but not hospitalization. We are all fortunate that our Officers are well, and want to remind all to thank our FPPD for putting their lives in danger to keep us safe.

Our joyous holiday season is often the time for Porch Pirates. These are individuals who steal recently delivered packages from in front of our homes and businesses. FPPD has some valuable suggestions to avoid being a victim of the Porch Pirates: specify that package deliveries go to the side or back door; ask a neighbor or friend to watch for a package when you're not at home or at your business; and do not schedule deliveries for weekends when you may not be present to receive them. As FPPD wishes all a happy holiday season, they want to help our residents and businesses avoid being victims of crimes.

#### **Conservation Society (FPCS)**

An annual highlight of autumn in Floral Park is the Fairie Forest Festival, celebrated at Centennial Gardens and Bird Sanctuary. ### **MTA**

We have been informed by the MTA that there will be no LIRR service between Jamaica Station and Atlantic Avenue from 9 PM, Friday, November 8<sup>th</sup> through 4 AM, Monday, November 11<sup>th</sup>. LIRR riders are encouraged to use subway service as an alternative. Riders can enter the at no cost by presenting LIRR tickets to station booth agents at the following stations: 34<sup>th</sup> Penn Station (2/3), 34<sup>th</sup> Herald Square, Fulton St. (G), Lafayette Ave., Nostrand Ave., and Broadway Junction. The last train to run on Friday night will be the 8:44 PM from Jamaica Station and the 8:51 PM from Atlantic Terminal.

### **DPW**

Our Highway department has been hard at work and has swept all roads, collected leaves in the West End, and replaced aging street signs. Sanitation Crews have collected 65 tons of household waste, 8 ½ tons of paper, 4 tons of glass and plastics, and 10 tons of bulk rubbish.

DPW is also in the process of getting the Village prepared for Monday's Veteran's Day Parade.

PSEG is currently installing conduits under Plainfield Avenue, please be aware of closures and detours while work is being done.

The Water Authority water main replacement is ongoing and work is currently underway. It is estimated to be completed in December with paving to take place in Spring 2025.

#### **Building Department**

A proposal has been received for 2 mixed use/apartment buildings at South Tyson/Van Siclen and Jericho Turnpike. The proposal at this time is at the conceptual stage only. The Northend Civic Association meeting allowed the owners to informally propose the idea to the public and receive feedback, prior to developing the detailed proposal. No formal plans have been submitted yet to the Village and there have been no formal public hearings. A project of this magnitude will need to go through many public hearings before the first shovel hits the ground. This will go step by step through the Zoning Board, Architectural Review Board, Village Board, Fire Marhsall's Office, Nassau County Planning Commission and the SEQRA process to name a few. We will keep the residents up to date as the process moves forward.

Construction is ongoing at the apartment building at 1 Carnation Avenue, the proposed restaurant at 99 Covert Avenue, and the re-construction of 266 Jericho Turnpike. These projects are moving forward well and expected to be completed in the next 6-12 months. Construction has begun at the Covert Avenue fire property. Shoring and foundation is ongoing and will take about a month. Overall construction is expected to take about a year. Permits are being issued for repairs and renovations at 212 Jericho Turnpike, the old Firestone building. ARB has recently approved a new storefront as well for that property.

As a reminder, all fences, driveways, and front walkways/stoops require a permit prior to installation to ensure compliance with the zoning codes. Please check the Building Department website for a full list of requirements and permit applications. Construction equipment, including power washers and leaf blowers are not permitted to be operated on Sundays and Holidays.

**A local law amending Section 99-5 of the Code of the Incorporated Village of Floral Park to add paragraph D.1 establishing a Parking Trust Fund.**

### **Section 1. Legislative Intent**

This local law adds subdivision “D.1” to Section 99-5 of the Village Code. Entitled “Alternate parking relief: Parking Trust Fund,” this new provision creates a Parking Trust Fund so as to authorize the Zoning Board of Appeals to grant variances with respect to parking on the condition that the Applicant pay into the Parking Fund per parking space, which monies will be held in trust and use to improve and maintain parking in the Village.

### **Section 2. Section 99-5 “D.1” Alternative parking relief; Parking Trust Fund as adopted:**

1. Legislative Intent. The Borad of Trustees hereby find that a shortage of municipal and private off-street parking exists within the Village, thus creating congestion and also causing a negative impact upon the viability of the Village’s business community. The Board also finds that an alternative method of obtaining a parking variance other than that set forth in §99-61 for the R-A, B-1, B-2 and B-3 districts will be in the best interests of the Village and will promote the health, safety and welfare of the community. Accordingly, in order to further the goal of creating future municipal and private off-street parking in the Village, the Board hereby seeks to establish a Parking Trust Fund.
2. Creation of Parking Trust Fund. There is hereby created a Parking Trust Fund in the Incorporated Village of Floral Park for the purpose of receiving funds upon the granting of alternate parking variances and for the further purpose of providing a source of funds for the provision of future municipal off-street parking, including the acquisition of land for said purposes.

3. Alternate parking variance procedure. In addition to the granting of parking variances pursuant to §99-61, the Zoning Board of Appeals shall be authorized to grant an alternate form of variance as set forth herein. The Zoning Board of Appeals may vary the parking requirements established in this section by reducing the number of parking spaces required for a specific use or structure at the property under consideration, provided that any such variance shall only be granted subject to a condition requiring a payment to the Village of the sum of up to \$2,500 per parking space so waived, varied or modified for deposit by the Village into the Parking Trust Fund.
4. Dedicated trust fund. Any moneys deposited into the Parking Trust Fund shall constitute a trust fund to be used by the Board of Trustees exclusively for municipal off-street parking, including the acquisition, improvement and maintenance of land, facilities or parking equipment for said purpose.
5. Payment required. Payment of the required fee to the Parking Trust Fund pursuant to an alternate parking variance grant of the Zoning Board of Appeals shall be a prerequisite to the issuance of a building permit or other municipal certificate.

### **Section 1. Legislative Intent**

This local law amends various sections of the Code so as to limit the height, size and location of garages on residential lots within the Village.

**Section 2. Section 99-3, 99-22, 99-24.A. and 99-25.K.(4) as amended:**

**§ 99-3 Definitions.**

BUILDING, ACCESSORY- A building, including a detached garage, subordinate and incidental to a main building on the same lot and used for the purposes customarily incidental to those of the main building.

GARAGE, PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL- A nonhabitable accessory building used for the parking of a motor vehicle upon residential property. If, for any reason, a private garage is removed, it must be replaced within six months. No residential garage shall be occupied by a commercial vehicle or truck. No lot may contain more than one detached garage.

**§99-22. Garages.**

- A. In the R-1 and R-2 Districts, a private detached garage accessory to a dwelling on the same lot or parcel shall be erected in a rear yard.
- B. In the R-1 and R-2 Districts, on a corner lot, a private detached garage accessory to a dwelling on the same lot or parcel shall be erected in the rear yard, provided that the depth of the lot is sufficient to permit compliance with the provisions of this chapter, and provided that the setback of such garage complies with the front yard requirements in the particular district.
- C. In any other district where residential use is permitted, a private detached garage shall be permitted as an accessory use to a multiple-family dwelling as part of the site plan approval process.
- D. In any R-1 or R-2 District, no accessory garage shall be erected to house more than two passenger vehicles and may not exceed 576 square feet.
- E. In residence zones, no accessory garage shall be constructed below grade, nor shall any such accessory garage be constructed or erected to a height which exceeds a maximum height of 14 feet as measured from the surrounding average grade to the uppermost point of the topmost limit of such structure and shall be located at least 10 feet from the dwelling.

**§99-24. Accessory buildings and structures.**

Except for outdoor pools, the regulations applying to which are set forth in § 99-25, the following regulations shall apply to accessory buildings, garages and structures in any residence district:

- A. A detached accessory building, garage, or structure in excess of 12 inches in height above average surrounding grade, other than fences, may be located in and may occupy not more than 30% of the area of any rear yard and shall be located a distance of at least:

- (1) Eight feet from any dwelling or main building.

- (2) One foot from any lot line, with no cornice overhanging such building more than six inches.
- (3) Forty-five feet from any street line, except that on a corner lot the distance shall be at least 45 feet from the line of the street of narrower frontage and 15 feet from the line of the street of greater frontage.

**§99-25. Swimming pools and prefabricated units.**

K. Location. Every swimming pool and prefabricated unit shall conform to the following requirements as to location:

(4) In addition, a private outdoor pool shall be located only in a rear yard, and the coverage thereof shall not exceed 30% of the area of the rear yard for all accessory buildings, garages and structures located therein; provided, however, that no such pool shall occupy more than 15% of the area of any rear yard.

**Local Law No. 7 of the year 2024**

A local law amending § 10-16 and adopting sections 10-18, 10-19, 10-20, 10-21 and 10-22 of the Code of the Incorporated Village of Floral Park.

### **Section 1. Legislative Intent**

This local law amends the Code to add provisions that prohibit the feeding of feral cats within the Village of Floral Park.

### **Section 2. Section 10-16 as amended and sections 10-18 through 10-22 as adopted:**

#### **§10-16. Applicability.**

This ordinance shall not be construed to apply to dogs, domestic cats or similar household pets.

#### **§10-18. Purpose.**

The purpose of this article shall be to preserve the public peace and good order in the Village of Floral Park and to contribute to the public welfare and the preservation and protection of the property and persons of the inhabitants of the Village by declaring and enforcing certain regulations on the feeding of feral cats.

#### **§10-19. Definitions.**

As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

DOMESTIC CAT- Any cat that is social to humans and normally maintained in the household of the owner or person who cares for such animal.

FERAL CAT- An animal of the species felis catus, more commonly known as “cat,” that has no owner and/or is a stray, wild or feral animal.

**§10-20. Feeding of feral cats prohibited.**

No person shall provide food in any manner to feral cats within the Village of Floral Park.

**§10-21. Penalties for offense.**

Any person who shall violate any provision of this article shall be punishable, upon conviction of a first offense, by a fine of not less than \$100 and not exceeding \$250; upon conviction of a second offense occurring within 12 months of the first offense, by a fine of not less than \$250, and not exceeding \$500; and upon conviction of a third offense occurring within 12 months of the first and second offenses, by a fine of not less than \$500.

**§10-22. Limit on number of domestic cats kept.**

No owner shall keep, harbor, board or otherwise have in his, her, its or their custody more than two adult cats on any premises within the Incorporated Village of Floral Park, New York. For the purpose of this section, any cat over the age of six months shall be considered an adult cat.

**Section 3. Severability**
